BEST PRACTICE - I

Attendance and Make-up Classes: The college continues to maintain the mechanisms for monitoring of Attendance and Make-up Classes as one of our Best Practices. The modalities remain unchanged as earlier in place.

Taking into account the quality of the students as the greatest asset, the College has taken up several measures to attain this. As a starting point the college has initiated a "best practice" in the area of maintaining strict attendance and ensuring that Contact Hours are recovered by absentees so that they are eligible for the specified Credits as given by the Nagaland University. Understanding that excellent attendance will automatically impact the overall performance of the student, recovery of lost contact hours are effectively worked out. Here, in lieu of fine impositions and simply accepting leave applications, students are assigned comprehensive exercises by the concerned teachers. With this deficit recovery system in place we have seen marked improvements.

As a further incentive, the college awards a prize and certificate to the highest attendance scorer every semester, with the condition that they should have a minimum of 90%. This is called the **Star Attendance Awards** with winners in different categories of attendance performance.

The college has thus adopted stringent and innovative measures to maintain high attendance as one of its best practices with the view to achieve all round quality enhancement as high attendance will also ensure that the student is immersed thoroughly in all curricular and extracurricular activities of the institution..

The impact of deficit contact hours 'makes up classes' is indeed phenomenal with the team of committed faculty members working sacrificially to make the contact hour deficit make up system an effective mechanism. The role of both the faculty and the students are involved in this success, firstly the students who qualify to write their

exams because of their efforts and hard labour in making up the deficits, secondly the faculty members who take additional responsibility in conducting those deficits. So far none of the students has been debarred from writing their end semester exams due to want of attendance requirements.

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BEST PRACTICE - II

Perspective Class: The concept and implementation of *Perspective Class* in C-Edge College has been introduced since 2013-14, within a year from the start of the College itself. From the time of its inception, it was envisaged to offer something different, a value added knowledge for our students, and one of the College "*Best Practices*".

This is a unique form of class lecture in an interactive format, designed by the College. The topics are open and wide ranging. The talks would not be based on the text book or syllabus per se, but it would generally be on the scope and concept of the subject matter, to provide a broader view by presenting ideas and materials from outside the scope of the text book or syllabus.

A *Perspective Class*, by definition would look at the subject matter from a different perspective by presenting a broader picture of the subject matter. This gives a deeper and better understanding of the subject to the students, and enables them to better master the same. It will also teach them the applicability of the subject and its impact in the real world. The *Perspective Class* would also teach students how to make a connection between the theory and the practical.

For those who already have a good academic grade, the *Perspective Class* challenges the students to a higher level of understanding. For those who are struggling, it helps them to get a better grasp of the subject. For those who thinks that the subject has little or no relevance in life, the *Perspective Class* challenges them with a motivation to think otherwise.

On any subject matter, a specific text book or the syllabus may not able to cover all different perspectives due to the nature of limited academic time available. But the objective is to equip the student to learn to do their own perspective studies and understanding. This is the true essence of education.

The *Perspective Class* is part of the repertoire set of skills that the College strives, to produce a cutting edge mindset of their graduates, and to make them useful and productive citizens of the society.

Case Study (example for a Perspective Class):

US-China Trade war

Why is there a US-China trade war? It has been started presumably on the premise of the \$350 US billion dollar trade deficit/surplus between the US and China. The issue is much deeper and complex than that alone. It involves the whole gamut of geo-politics, including culture, history, trade, technology, military, international relations and much more. Its outcome is likely to define the world order of the 21st Century. A world defining event within our lifetimes.

Principal's Note 2019 - 2020

This session has brought us such uncharted times! After more than a hundred years, the world is now in the throes of a pandemic. The world first heard about a new strain of the Corona Virus, manifesting first in China some months ago and now we are in the midst of a national Lockdown. Corona viruses have been around a long time in the air as the cause of influenza or the common cold. But the behaviour of this new strain was very different and so was initially referred to as the Novel Corona Virus (meaning new, unusual); the official name of Covid 19 was coined later to distinguish it from the commonly existing ones. Covid 19 exploded very rapidly into a pandemic and has impacted very harshly in every sphere of our lives.

Religious and social lives have practically come to a standstill, economies have been shattered; and I feel that one of the worst hit has been the educational sector. Many teachers and institution staff have lost jobs or faced severe pay cuts. Students are on the verge of losing an academic year, new learning systems without proper preparation and infrastructure give rise to concerns about the quality of education imbibed.

At this point, it fills my heart with so much of gratitude to all the faculty, staff and students who have steadfastly upheld our college in all the works. We have quickly picked up alternative modes of teaching and learning. And we have managed to keep all activities, both academic and non-scholastic on track, albeit restructured and online. This tells much of the sincerity and diligence of the C-Edge community. Along with the regular events such as the Sports Meet, International Language Day, Commencement Day, Public Speaking and Literary competitions, Fine Arts and Cultural Day, Freshers Week, etc, we have seen some fresh events such as the first EU Camp. In spite of cyclonic storms and floods, the NSS Special Camp was held successfully too. We are particularly thrilled that our graduating class has brought laurels to the college with one Gold Medalist, four Top Ten rank holders and twelve subject distinction achievers.

In spite of all the challenges, we can still look at some of the brighter aspects too. We could say that one of the greatest achievements a person can make would be the ability to emerge stronger and wiser from adverse circumstances. And, together we weather the storms ahead and continue steadfast in our vision and Mission for quality education
